Dear Residents of Delhi,

As winter envelops Delhi, we all have to grapple every year with the stranglehold of severe air pollution. The adverse impact on the health of children, the elderly, and those with respiratory conditions cannot be overstated, although even the healthiest amongst us are undoubtedly affected by hazardous air quality.

One of the contributors to pollution in Delhi is vehicular emissions. To curb this source of pollution, the Hon'ble Supreme Court and the Commission for Air Quality Management have laid down directives and guidelines to be followed. Heavy penalties are being imposed on violators. The fact that Delhites are continuing to pay fines everyday and over age vehicles are still being impounded, clearly indicates that there are many who continue to flout the directives.

We in Delhi Traffic Police are sincerely disappointed and pained by this attitude. Pollution control is not a one-man job. The police cannot bring the air quality back to normal. It needs immediate collective action, with each of us doing his and her bits.

Another important aspect of pollution control is continuity. We automatically slip into old pollution- harmful ways once the winter season and polluted days are behind us. We have to be constantly on vigil throughout the year and not wake up only when the AQI starts showing severe air quality.

We have all been taught that prevention is better than cure. We have to put this into practice. Adherence to pollution control has to become a daily routine. Whether it's following speed limits, reducing idling time, or adhering to emission standards, every small effort counts. In addition to this, we urge you to avoid taking out old, inefficient vehicles that emit excessive pollutants on the roads. If you are currently driving an older vehicle, consider alternatives such as public transport, carpooling, or using newer, more environmentally friendly vehicles that comply with modern emission standards.

I beseech every Delhite to take a pledge to save the environment from degradation and prevent pollution. This is the only way you and I can breathe with ease.

Lets drive change for a cleaner, safer and prosperous Delhi in 2025. Thank you for your cooperation.

Battling Pollution

A mammoth posse of Delhi Traffic Police stood on the National Capital's streets day and night battling the deadly air pollution to enforce GRAP 4 and other Supreme Court directives in a bid to catapult the air quality back to normal.

88 Prakhar vans were pressed into action for intensive checking, patrolling and issuing challans to GRAP 4 and other traffic rule violators. These vans are equipped with high tech systems including Mobile Data Terminus (MDT), inbuilt GPS, wireless sets etc.



1200 new challan machines were distributed in districts and traffic circles of Delhi to penalise violators.

60,000 masks have been acquired for Delhi Traffic Police personnel manning the polluted streets. The plan is to distribute 5000 masks among the personnel per month.

Police pickets and barricades have been increased for intensive checking.

Special Yoga sessions are organized to help the traffic police personnel combat the adverse effects of pollution and maintain perfect physical and mental health while managing their demanding duties.

Wellness programs for personnel also include regular health check ups, stress management workshops, awareness sessions on proactive measures against pollution and other lifestyle disorders.

TACKLING DELHI BORDER CHALLENGES

Delhi Traffic Police has launched multi dimensional measures to address the complex issues of Delhi's borders:



COORDINATION WITH HARYANA AND UP:

Several meetings, both physical and via video conferencing were held under the chairmanship of Sh Ajay Chaudhry, IPS, Spl Commissioner, TMD (Zone II) and other competent officials with counterparts of Haryana and Uttar Pradesh for effective implementation of GRAP IV and other directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court.

DELHI SHARES 125 BORDER POSTS WITH NEIGHBOURING STATES:

Delhi has 125 border posts at Haryana and UP borders. Of these 23 are big posts. These big posts witnesses 97 per cent of the traffic from out of Delhi. 13 of these big posts have plazas built on them. 10 more plazas are coming up

ENHANCED BORDER PATROLLING:

More than 500 traffic police personnel have been deployed in Delhi's borders with Uttar Pradesh and Haryana, mainly at Gurgaon, Faridabad, Sonepat, Ghaziabad, Noida etc to ensure adherence to GRAP 1V and other SC directives.

In normal days good weather days, around 250 traffic police personnel guard these borders.

PERMISSION TO GO INTO ANOTHER STATE:

Delhi Traffic Police personnel are allowed to go 2km -5km into Haryana and UP to check vehicles coming into Delhi and turn them back if they are found violating pollution norms.



NEWS IN BRIEF

HAPPENINGS

- Starting from 20 December'24, all seven District Courts of Delhi will together hold 12 special evening courts from 5pm to 7 pm on every working day to settle pending traffic challans issued by Delhi Traffic Police.
- **●** Each court will settle 200 challans per evening session. Thus, a total of 2400 pending challans will be settled per day.
- Delhites can get details about their pending challans in traffic.delhipolice.gov.in/ evecourtdcc.
- Concerned vehicle owners are requested to download details of pending challans and reach designated courts, pay the required fines and get the challans disposed off.
- Started on trial basis, this step is expected to hugely reduce the large pending list of challans.
- The seven district court complex are in Patiala House, Saket, Rohini, Dwarka, Tis Hazari, Karkardooma and Rouse Avenue.

Some Advisories for Safe Driving:

Follow traffic rules, do not jump red lights or talk on mobile while driving.

Always carry your license, PUC certificate, and insurance.

Always wear seatbelt.

Do not change lanes frequently.

Stick to permitted speed limits

Do not ride 2-wheeler without helmet

Delhi's wide and smooth roads can turn killer within split of a second if attention gets diverted or utmost carefulness is not observed while driving.

An Army subedar and his Air Force official wife learnt this the hard way when their car flipped and overturned in Dhaula Kuan road late at 2.30 am on 16 December.

The couple were fortunate that DCP Traffic (Hq) Shashank Jaiswal was travelling to meet his mother at that same time and spotted the overturned car with leaking fuel.

Jumping to the rescue, Jaiswal informed the Police Control Room, and with his Delhi Police team and some passersbys broke the windows of the car which had jammed due to the accident, brought out the couple and even reached them safely home after checking that their injuries were minor.

The gallant young officer has similarly helped several road victims in distress in the past. He deserves kudos.



THE CHALLAN ROADMAP - WHAT HAPPENS AFTER THE CAMERA CATCHES RED LIGHT / OVER SPEED VIOLATION

Inside Delhi Traffic Police's Red Light Violation Detection (RLVD) & Overspeed Violation Detection (OSVD) Centre












- Delhi registers an approximate 35,000 Red Light and Over Speeding violations daily.
- Of these, Red Light violations are slightly more than Over Speeding. The violations increase during holidays and marriage season.
- Delhi Traffic Police has installed high -tech cameras for foolproof detection of Red Light and Over Speeding violations at various intersections and stretches.
- Cameras are fitted in 109 locations all over Delhi. Of these 48 are for Red Light violation detection and 66 are for over speed violation detection.
- Once the camera catches violation, the footage is transferred to the envoys server and synchronized with the vehicle number, make, model, color etc. The data is next transferred to the police personnel manning the RLVD/ OSVD centre at Traffic Headquarters, Todapur. These operators working 24 x7 in shifts validate the data with NIC.
- The validated challans are sent to NIC for sending SMS to violators/ owners. If mobile number is not updated, speed posts/ notices are sent to registered addresses.


ARE YOU A TRAFFIC PRAHARI?

Inside Delhi Traffic Police's Red Light Violation Detection (RLVD) & Overspeed Violation Detection (OSVD) Centre









- TRAFFIC PRAHARI is a mobile app that empowers citizens to report traffic violations and other issues to Delhi Police in real time.
- Alert citizens / interested users have to download the app on Google PlayStore or App Store
- Users can take photos and videos of the violating vehicles and upload them real time on the app including details like date, time, location, registration number of violating vehicle, type of violation etc.
- The data is transferred to the RLVD/ OSVD centre at Delhi Traffic Headquarters, Todapur, where operators review and validate the data. If found correct, the operators send the report to NIC wherefrom offenders receive challans via SMS or Speedpost depending on whether their mobile numbers are updated or not,
- Citizens can report misconduct or overcharging by autorickshaw or taxi drivers also in this app.
- A list of violations are present in the app including :

Dangerous Driving/ Over taking

Defective Number Plate

Riding without helmet

Triple riding

Violating stop line

Parking on footpath etc

Approximate number of 200 violation reports are received per day on the app.

ROAD SAFETY EDUCATION FOR STUDENTS

TRAFFIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGN ON THE ROADS



Road safety awareness; No Honking in front of hospitals; awareness against driving with high beam lights; lectures on women safety in Delhi; lectures on good road behaviour by auto, taxi and DTC bus drivers were among the many campaigns organised by Delhi Traffic Police in various locations of the National Capital.

ANTI ENCROACHMENT DRIVES

- Traffic Police, Eastern Range undertook a massive anti encroachment drive under supervision of DCP Eastern Range, Rajeev Kumar, IPS.
- Drives were carried out at ISBT Anand Vihar, Shahdara Metro Station, Mayur Vihar Metro Station, Bhajan Pura Market etc in Eastern Range
- During the visit of DCP Rajeev Kumar, IPS, it was observed that at all the places roads were encroached by hawkers, illegal vendors, wrongly parked vehicles such as TSR, buses, private taxis which narrowed down useable road space causing traffic congestion and difficulty to walk.
- Anti Encroachment drive was carried out on 12th December, appropriate legal action was initiated against encroachers and offenders.
- ACsP/T/ Eastern Range and TIs Eastern Range strategized under the guidance of DCP/T/ Eastern Range to carry out this massive anti encroachment drive.
- A total of 27 challans against improper parking, besides 96 VOCA challans and 62 E- Challans were issued under appropriate sections of law...
- 13 Rehri -patri of illegal vendors/ encroachers were removed.
- 13 vehicles were towed away during the drive.



Hawkers and illegal vendors have narrowed down roads and filled footpaths with their wares



Illegally parked vehicles on either side of roads had narrowed down roads causing congestion



Removal of encroachments and illegally parked vehicles have made roads congestion free for traffic and easier to walk for pedestrians.





ASI (EXE) BALWAN SINGH:

With almost forty years of service in Delhi Police including 7 years in the Traffic Department, ASI Balwan Singh has a rich repertoire of interesting anecdotes including interception of stolen vehicles and spreading Road Safety awareness among students and general public.





ASI(EXE) ASHOK SINGH :

Retired after 39 years of satisfactory service, ASI Ashok Singh recollects with pride how he and his team arrested a militant with AK 47 and a slew of other sophisticated arms from Paonta Sahib Gurudwara in Himachal Pradesh in 1994 and was rewarded by Delhi Police for bravery. He urges Delhites to pool cars and use public transport to reduce pollution.

ASI (EXE)VIJAYAN B:

With 37 years of service with Delhi Police including over 6 years in Traffic Department, Vijayan B has now returned to his home state Kerala to do rubber and banana farming. He reveals he used to drink coffee and eat jaggery to get relief from chest congestion due to exposure to excessive pollution on Delhi roads.





SI(EXE) KIRPAL SINGH:

With 36 years of service behind him, SI Kirpal Singh hailing from a village in Mahendragarh district of Haryana is proud to have served Delhi Police in various capacities. He fondly recalls his years with Traffic Division where he majorly served in the Control Room.

SI (EXE)RANJEET SINGH:

With almost 39 years of service with Delhi Police including over 6 years in Traffic Department, SI Ranjeet Singh is proud to have received an out of turn promotion from Constable to Head Constable in 1990 after he single handedly fought a pickpocket in Delhi Bus number 520 plying in South Delhi. He was stabbed and had to be hospitalised but his bravery led to arrest of 5 thugs. In the Traffic Department he majorly gave lectures on Road Safety awareness in schools and colleges





SI(EXE) NARENDER KUMAR:

With 39 years of service behind him including nine years with the Traffic Department, SI Narender Kumar reels off many interesting anecdotes about his service life which he describes as the golden period of his life.





In view of heavy pollution in entire Delhi, I suggest that the entire traffic police force should be provided with good quality and effective protective face masks. They should also be subjected to medical examination on a regular basis.

In certain sensitive spots of the city where unruly elements take a hostile attitude towards police engaged in anti encroachment or illegal roadside parking drives, the traffic police should be suitably armed, so that they can take strong stand immediately.

ALL DRIVERS PLEASE PAY ATTENTION



As per directions of Special Commissioner (Transport Department), GNCT of Delhi and under Section 115 of Motor Vehicle Act, 1988, following is hereby ordered during the imposition of GRAP Stage-IV 'Severe' Air Quality actions, in addition to the Stage-I, II, and III actions already in force, from 8:00 A.M. of 19th November, 2024 in the National Capital Territory of Delhi:

- 1.No Entry for Truck traffic into Delhi is allowed, other than for trucks carrying essential commodities/providing essential services and all LNG/CNG/Electric Trucks and BS-VI Diesel vehicles.
- 2.No Entry for LCVs Registered outside Delhi, other than EVs/CNG/LNG/BS-VI Diesel, to enter Delhi, except those carrying essential commodities/providing essential services.
- 3.Ban on plying of Delhi-Registered Diesel operated Medium Goods Vehicles (MGVs) and Heavy Goods Vehicles (HGVs) in Delhi, except those carrying essential commodities/providing essential services.

The above directions will remain implemented till further order by CAQM. These directions shall not apply to trucks carrying essential commodities i.e. medicines, raw vegetables, fruits, grains, milk, eggs, meat, fish & ice that is to be used as food item and tankers carrying petroleum products.

Any violation of the above directions shall invite a prosecution under section 194(1) of Motor Vehicle Act, 1988, which provides a fine of Rs. 20,000/-.

- 1- BS-III पेट्रोल और BS-IV डीजल LMV (चार पहिया वाहनों) के चलने पर प्रतिबंध है।
- 2- दिल्ली में पंजीकृत BS-IV और उससे नीचे के डीजल से चलने वाले HGV/MGV के चलने पर प्रतिबंध है सिवाय उन वाहनों के जो आवश्यक वस्तुओं को ले जा रहे हों या आवश्यक सेवाएं प्रदान कर रहे हों।
- 3- ईवी, सीएनजी, बीएस=VI डीजल के अलावा दिल्ली के बाहर पंजीकृत LCV (यात्री +माल) के दिल्ली में प्रवेश पर प्रतिबंध है सिवाय उन वाहनों के जो आवश्यक वस्तुओं को ले जा रहे हों या आवश्यक सेवाएं प्रदान कर रहे हों।
- 4- ईवी, सीएनजी, बीएस =VI डीजल के अलावा एनसीआर राज्यों से अंतरराज्यीय बसों के दिल्ली में प्रवेश पर प्रतिबंध है। (एआईटीपी बसों व टेम्पो ट्रैवलर को छोडकर)
- 5- यातायात के दिल्ली में प्रवेश पर प्रतिंबध (आवश्यक वसतुओं को ले जाने वाले व आवश्यक सेवाएं प्रदान करने वाले सभी एलएनजी, सीएनजी, इलेक्ट्रिक, बीएस-VI डीजल ट्रकों को छोडकर)





To combat hazardous air pollution under GRAP-IV regulations:



Vehicle restrictions:

BS-IV vehicles (except essential services), petrol vehicles more than 15 years, diesel vehicles more than 10 years are banned. BS-VI, EVs & CNG vehicles are allowed.



Construction banned:

Construction work fully banned till further order.



Reduced workforce:

50% office capacity recommended; Work-from-home encouraged.



All classes up to 12th are to be conducted in online mode only.



Firecrackers banned Complete ban on all

kinds of firecrackers on manufacturing, storage, selling and bursting in Delhi NCR.
